**1** BLESS YOURSELF WITH THE HOLY CROSS AND SAY:  
In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

**2** SAY THE APOSTLES' CREED  
I believe in God, the Father Almighty,  
Maker of heaven and earth.  
And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our  
Lord, who was conceived by the Holy  
Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered  
under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died  
and was buried. He descended into hell.  
The third day He rose again from the  
dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at  
the right hand of God, the Father  
Almighty. From thence He will come to  
judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy  
Christian church, the communion of  
saints, the forgiveness of sins, the  
resurrection of the body, and the life  
everlasting. Amen.

**3** PRAY THE LORD'S PRAYER  
Our Father, who art in  
heaven,  
hallowed be Thy name,

**4** PRAY THE MORNING OR EVENING PRAYER

*Morning.* I thank You, my  
heavenly Father, through Jesus  
Christ, Your dear Son, that You  
have kept me this night from all  
harm and danger; and I pray that  
You would keep me this day also  
from sin and every evil, that all my  
doings and life may please You.  
For into Your hands I commend  
myself, my body and soul, and all  
things. Let Your holy angel be with  
me, that the evil foe may have no  
power over me. Amen.

*Evening.* I thank you, my  
heavenly Father, through Jesus  
Christ, Your dear Son, that You  
have graciously kept me this day;  
and I pray that You would forgive  
me all my sins where I have done  
wrong, and graciously keep me this  
night. For into Your hands, I  
commend myself, my body and  
soul, and all things. Let Your holy  
angel be with me, that the evil foe  
may have no power over me. Amen.

THEME OF THE WEEK: He is Risen to Proclaim the Truth

"Cantate Domino novum canticum". "Sing to the Lord a new song." This singing is like that found in Advent 3 (Gaudette) and Lent 4 (Laetare) in that all three have an air of anticipation for what is quickly approaching. In today's case, we are anticipating the coming of both the Ascension and Pentecost Sunday. This anticipation is seen in our Gospel where Jesus connects His going away with the coming of the Helper, the Holy Spirit. This Holy Spirit is the One Who gives us the gifts of God — the means of our salvation in water, bread, wine, and Word, given in the Divine Service. He guards us and keeps us in faith. He works through us to declare that Jesus' cross won forgiveness.

SUN

SCRIPTURE: John 16:5-15 These Three: Sin, Righteousness, and Judgement

The Helper Holy Spirit Who proceeds from both Father and Son comes. He convicts us of sin, righteousness, and judgment. He does the work of convicting you of your sin with His Law, thereby showing your need for a Savior. He declares into your hearts, by your ears, the Great Good News of Jesus' death and resurrection for those same sins. Lastly, He declares that you, and the world, have been judged — you to salvation in Christ, the world to condemnation for rejection of forgiveness. The Helper Holy Spirit declares Jesus is for you. *Holy Spirit, convict us of sin, redeem us by the righteousness of Christ, and judge us according to Jesus' blood. Amen.*

MON

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 82 Judgment of Salvation

"In the midst of the gods He holds judgment." In the midst of the rulers of the nations, God is the One in control. God alone is the One Who holds judgment. We already saw that He sends His Spirit to declare sin, righteousness, and judgment. He is the Judging One, not the rulers of this world, who have no knowledge or understanding. He understands all. He knows all and He knows you. He redeemed you by the blood of His Son. On the cross, He has delivered you from the enemies of your soul. *God, keep me in Your judgment of salvation. Amen.*

TUE

SCRIPTURE: James 1:16-21 Righteousness of God

The "good and perfect gifts" are the means by which Jesus declares you sons and daughters, and He does not change. He is the same yesterday, today, and tomorrow. He makes you His children through His gifts of Baptism, which is water and His Word. His doing. He makes you into His children, His creation. He saves you in His Son, the Word implanted into your souls, which redeems you. In Jesus alone you produce the righteousness of God, for Jesus is the Righteousness of God. *Lord, keep us righteous in Your eyes. Amen.*

WED

SCRIPTURE: Isaiah 12:1-6 God is My Salvation

Isaiah 11 is about the coming "Root of Jesse." That day, the New Testament time of salvation has come for you. His deeds of forgiveness, life, and salvation are made known around the earth. Like ancient Israel, you have been delivered from bondage to sin, death, and the devil. In baptism, you drink from the wells of salvation that produce living water inside of you. God's anger is turned away from your sin and placed upon Jesus on the cross, whereby you are comforted. Strength and song are shown in weakness and death for you. *Jesus, remain the God of my salvation. Amen.*

THU

SCRIPTURE: John 8:21-36 The Son has Set You Free

Jesus, the Son, has set you free from bondage to sin, death, and the devil. He was lifted upon Calvary where he satisfied God's anger against the world's sin by his spiritual sufferings. Believe in Him and live. He is the Son who took upon Himself the form of a slave so that you would be declared sons of God. Abraham longed for this day of salvation. He witnessed a part of it with Issac upon the mountain. Now it is fulfilled in Christ, the Son Who sets you free. Not partially. Not mostly. You are free and forgiven of all of your sins. *Lord, I believe, help my unbelief. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: 2 Corinthians 5:14-21 New Creation

The ministry of reconciliation. Be reconciled to God. How can we do this? By ourselves, we cannot. Only Jesus, Who became sin for us, reconciles us to the Father. He has taken all of your sins and put them to death upon His Cross. He has taken them from you in the lavish flood of Holy Baptism. In the font, He took your sin and you received His righteousness. No more are your sins counted against you. In Jesus, you are a dead and raised, new creation. *Lord, keep us new in You. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 126 Ascent Lord's Supper

Psalms 120-134 were sung by pilgrims as they journeyed their way up to Jerusalem. They all deal with hardship and oppression in a foreign land that gives way to the blessings found in Zion. For this is us every time we are in the Divine Service. We leave the unbelieving world behind as we journey into the presence of God in His dedicated worship space. We ascend to the Lord's table with tears over our sins, our shame, our deceits, lies, and ugliness. We leave with shouts of joy in the forgiveness of sins because we hear and believe the Lord's gracious promises. *Lord, help us rejoice in Your Supper. Amen.*
