Around the Word Devotions + the week of August 21-27, 2022

THEME OF THE WEEK: The Worship of God Wrought by the Spirit

Several of the Scripture lessons assigned for this week deal with the matter of God's judgment—not on the pagan but on those who have the Word and reject it. While this may be an uncomfortable topic for the Christian to consider, it is necessary, for “these things took place as examples for us, that we might not desire evil as they did.” (1 Cor. 10:6) Let us take these warnings to heart, repent when we despise preaching and God's Word, and flee to our Lord Jesus, who comes to forgive us in His Word and Sacraments. When we worship the Triune God in faith, wrought by the Holy Spirit, we find a gracious and merciful Lord who is slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love.

SCRIPTURE: Luke 19:41-48 – Saved from God's Wrath

Traditionally on this Sunday, the historical account of the destruction of Jerusalem is read during the Divine Service. This is to remind us sinners that God's wrath against sin is real and that we should fear it and not do anything against Him. But in the same Service we also hear of God's mercy, that His only-begotten Son went to Jerusalem to suffer and die for our sins and the sins of the whole world. Therefore we should also love and trust in Christ, Who has justified us by His blood and saved us from the wrath of God.

Lord Jesus, thank You for having compassion on us and redeeming us by Your death on the cross. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 119:73-80 – Hope in the Word

God's hands have made and fashioned us; therefore we have the duty to serve and obey Him. However, our thoughts and desires are soiled with sin, so we cannot know how to do this by our own reason and strength. That's why we pray that God would give us understanding that we may learn His commandments. That prayer is answered in God's gift of His Word, where we not only learn of His Law but also His steadfast love and mercy in the Gospel. Thus we also hope in Jesus, the Word made flesh, by whose mercy we live.

SCRIPTURE: 1 Corinthians 12:1-11 – Spiritual Gifts

There are many strange ideas as to who the Holy Spirit is or what He does, but if we want to know the truth, we should listen to Jesus: “The Spirit of truth will bear witness about Me.” (John 15:26) The Spirit bears witness about Jesus in the Word, which is faithfully confessed by Christians throughout history and around the world. Though it may be in various kinds of tongues, this utterance of wisdom and knowledge is one. For it is the same gift given by the same Spirit to say “Jesus is Lord!”

Heavenly Father, send Your Holy Spirit that we may confess before the world that Jesus Christ is Lord. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Luke 22:24-30 – Greatness in the Kingdom of Heaven

Today the Church remembers St. Bartholomew, also known as Nathaniel, one of Jesus' twelve apostles. He was there on the night of Jesus' betrayal, disputing with the rest as to which of them was the greatest. He probably had no idea that night that the rest of his life would be filled with persecution and ultimately end with martyrdom. But this is greatness in the kingdom of heaven: to serve others in confessing Jesus Christ and Him crucified and to remain faithful even unto death. May God grant us strength to stay with Jesus in all trials, just like Bartholomew.

Lord, thank You for the faithful example set by Your servant Bartholomew. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Matthew 11:16-24 – Justified by Jesus' Deeds

The natural man does not accept the things of the Spirit of God, for they are folly to him. That's why neither John nor Jesus was accepted in their day. But those who saw Jesus' mighty works and still rejected Him in unbelief will face greater judgment. God forbid that of us! SCRIPTURE: Hebrews 3:7-15 – Exhort One Another Every Day

Having been admonished by God's Law this week, do not despair, but trust in the Lord, remembering all that He has done for you: namely, He sent His Son to suffer and die for you that you would be saved eternally.
