SCRIPTURE: **Matthew 21:1-9 – Blessed is He Who Is Coming**

I recently saw an ad for a Christmas sweater that said, “Happy Birthday, Jesus.” Is that all Christmas is? If it is merely about a birthday party for Jesus, then there is no need for Advent. Indeed, many Christians have even moved away from observing Advent all together. But we must remember that Christmas isn’t about just an event that happened long ago. It is about the ever-present reality that God became flesh and dwelt among us. It is a reminder that He is never far away, and that He is coming again soon. This is why we have Advent. The crowd rightly shouted their praise for Christ as He entered Jerusalem so long ago. Let us also be prepared to rejoice on the day when Christ comes again. *O Lord, grant me the right understanding of these days that I may prepare to celebrate Your incarnation with true joy. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: **Psalms 1 – The Way of the Righteous**

Blessed in the man. We all want to be blessed. Yet, we still find ourselves listening to people whom we shouldn’t listen to. We scoff, mock, and sin. That’s why our Lord Jesus Christ took on human flesh. Through His incarnation, He came to take the wrath that we deserve. Though He loved the Law of God and fulfilled it, He was treated as the one who took bad counsel, who scoffed, mocked and sinned. He was hung on the tree planted not by a stream of water, but upon the hill of Golgotha. And thanks be to God that His righteousness becomes our righteousness. He takes your sins and makes you clean and righteous in Him. Truly, Christ knows the way of the righteous, and He puts us on the path. *O Lord, forgive me my many sins and keep me on the path of righteousness for Your name sake. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: **Romans 13:11-14 – Christ is the Light**

At this time of year, we often have guests in our homes. How do you prepare? Do you clean and set things in order? This is not done to create a false sense of reality, but to put things how we know they should be. In the same way, Paul reminds the Christians in Rome that Christ is coming. To prepare for His return, they are encouraged to put their lives in order. To not dwell in darkness and sin, but be wrapped in the righteous light of Christ. So it is for us today as we go through Advent. Let us also put on Christ and so prepare ourselves for His coming, that He may receive us with joy. *O Lord, bless me that I may resist all sin and evil and gladly serve and obey You, for You are my life and my hope. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: **Jeremiah 33:14-18 – Righteous Priest and King**

God’s promise to David is fulfilled not just through the birth of Christ, but through the incarnation of the Son of God. This week we remember that Advent and Christmas aren’t just about the birth of Jesus, but about His incarnation. It is through the incarnation of the Son of God into the line of David and through His offspring that Jesus is the king of Israel forever. And Hebrews tells us that Jesus is also a priest forever after the order of Melchizedek. It is this incarnate Lord that is our priest, our king, and our righteousness forever. *Almighty God, I praise You for Your boundless love in which You sent Your son to become the sacrifice for sins and secure His place as king and priest over me forever. Grant me ever increasing faithfulness and trust in Him. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: **Luke 1:1-25 – Heralded by Angels**

The incarnation of Christ was such a significant event that other miracles are connected to His coming. It wasn’t enough that the virgin should conceive and bear a son, but that in order to prepare the way for His ministry another miracle had to happen. A childless couple is granted a child. And not just any child, a prophet filled with the Holy Spirit from the womb. John was given the blessed task to point people to the incarnate Son of God, the One who is the Lamb that takes away the sin of the world! This is the power and glory of our Lord, that His coming is accompanied by other signs. *Lord, thank You for the prophetic ministry of John who pointed people to Christ. Thank You for all those who have pointed me to You. Bless all faithful ministers of the Gospel during these busy days, especially my own pastor. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: **Colossians 1:12-23 – Hold it Together**

Our Lord Jesus Christ holds everything together. Everything. Have you ever thought of that before? We often ascribe everything to simple naturalistic and mechanical explanations of the universe. But those things all serve Christ. He is the One who sits at the controls of everything. The One through whom everything was created and Who is responsible for every aspect of our universe. And He knows you. He created you specifically. He loves you and He died for you. He holds everything about our lives in His hands as well. This is a comforting thought. Jesus has it all under control, even if we struggle to understand everything happening. *O Lord, grant me the faith necessary to trust that You are with me and that Your blessings are enough to provide for all my needs. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: **Psalms 143 – Longing for the Lord**

In this Psalm, David writes of his longing for God’s goodness. We, like David, know the weight of our own sinfulness as well as the burden of the reality of our sinful world. The cry of the Church has been since the days of the Apostles, “Come quickly, Lord Jesus!” We look forward to the day when Christ returns and sets right all of creation. On that day, Christ will return to judge the world, and we have nothing to fear for we are wrapped in His righteousness. In the meantime, we will continue to pray with the Church throughout the ages, “Come quickly, Lord Jesus!” *O Lord, give me what I need to live in the midst of this world but also come quickly to rescue me from this wicked and fallen world. Amen.*

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
