For into Your hands I commend

power over me. Amen.

Evening. I thank you, my
heavenly Father, through Jesus
Christ, Your dear Son, that You
have graciously kept me this day;
and I pray that You would forgive
me all my sins where I have done
wrong, and graciously keep me this
night. For into Your hands, I
commend myself, my body and
soul, and all things. Let Your holy
angel be with me, that the evil foe
may have no power over me. Amen.

THEME OF THE WEEK: **The Lord's Call to Follow Him**

As we approach Ash Wednesday and the sacred season of Lent, we hear again the call to "Return to the LORD, your God" (Joel 2:13b). And since the LORD "is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love," we can return to Him (Joel 2:13c). Like the blind man sitting by the roadside, we know that God's mercy is found in Jesus, "Son of Man" and "Son of David" Who was "delivered over to the Gentiles" to be mocked, flogged and killed for us and our salvation (Lk. 18:31-32). Baptized into Christ, we follow Him by dying daily to sin so that we might also arise with Him to live by His grace and in His mercy.

SUN

SCRIPTURE: **Luke 18:31-43 Word of Jesus, Eyes of Faith**

The blind beggar knows who Jesus is and cries out to Him in faith. He cries out to Jesus for mercy even when told to be silent! Ironically, he asks Jesus for his sight, but like the thief on the cross he already sees with the eyes of faith (Lk. 23:42). Receiving physical sight and divine mercy from Jesus, the man once blind is, unlike the rich man who turned away sad (Lk. 18:18-30), ready to follow Jesus. Saint Paul teaches us that faith comes by hearing "the word of Christ" and not by seeing with our eyes (Rom. 10:17). Called by His Word through the waters of Holy Baptism, we believe that Jesus is "the Son of David" and are ready to follow Him wherever He leads. *Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me and lead me in the way of everlasting life. Amen.*

MON

SCRIPTURE: **Psalms 26 Walking in the Ways of the LORD**

David is not righteous before God in and of himself. We know full well, as does he, that his life was not without sin and failure. David knows that the LORD must redeem his life according to His grace (v.11). And yet, David's desire is to walk in the ways of the LORD and not in the ways of the wicked. As one who has been gathered into the assembly of the righteous, he knows that his life is set apart for service to the LORD. So it is with those who have been baptized into Christ Jesus. Buried with Christ into His death and raised with Him by the glory of the Father, we too walk in the ways of the LORD and the new life given to us in Christ Jesus (Rom. 6:4). *O Lord Jesus, be gracious to me and guide me to walk in Your ways always. Amen.*

TUE

SCRIPTURE: **1 Corinthians 13:1-13 Love is a Verb**

Our culture reduces love down to emotions, feelings, and favorite interests. But love as demonstrated by our God and shown to us in the person of Christ Jesus is far more and greater than these things! He who loved us "while we were still sinners" and "enemies" of God by laying down His life for us (Rom. 5:8-10), calls us to love one another as He has loved us (Jn. 13:34). Saint Paul gives us concrete examples of how we are to love our brothers and sisters in Christ. Love acts and serves. Love is selfless, not self-seeking. Love takes no joy in evil, but rejoices in the truth. Love flows out of faith because Christ first loved us (1 Jn. 4:10). His love abides and never ends, even when our love fails. *O Lord, help me to love others as You have loved me. Amen.*

WED

SCRIPTURE: **Matthew 6:16-21 Hearts Fixed on Jesus - Ash Wednesday**

Today the Lord calls us again to return to Him in repentance and faith as we begin the holy season of Lent. What do we need to confess before Him this day? What do we need to repent of and turn from today? Plenty to be sure! After teaching His disciples about Godly piety that should be practiced (almsgiving, prayer, and fasting), Jesus warns them and us of the universal temptation to fix our hearts and tighten our grip on earthly things that rust and decay. Jesus invites all to repent of their idolatrous grip on earthly treasures and to place their faith and trust in Him alone; the life that He gives and the identity He bestows upon us. *O Lord, incline my heart to trust in You and You alone for all things needful in this life and the next. Amen.*

THU

SCRIPTURE: **John 12:23-36 Wheat and Men Must Die to Bear Fruit**

Jesus says throughout His ministry, "My hour has not yet come" (Jn. 2:4). But now, Jesus' "hour" has in fact come! What is this "hour"? It is the hour of His passion, His being "lifted up from the earth" on a cross and crucified for your sins and the sins of the whole world (v. 32). In this hour Jesus is glorified not *in spite* of the cross, but *through* the cross. This is what He has come to do for you. This is both His active and passive obedience before the Father for you. Jesus' death and resurrection bears the fruit of forgiveness, life and salvation for you. The only way to live in Jesus and follow Him is to die daily with Him, that raised with Him we might bear the fruits of faith. *Lord Jesus, help me to die with You that I might also live with You. Amen.*

FRI

SCRIPTURE: **1 Peter 3:18-22 Baptism Now Saves You!**

Peter could not be any clearer here; "Baptism... now saves you" (v.21)! Baptism is not a symbolic act preformed by man, not a bath that removes dirt from the body. Baptism is God's way of making you a new creation in Christ Jesus. Just as Noah and his family were brought safely through the flood waters that cleansed the earth of evil, so those who are baptized into Christ are drown in His death and are raised with Him to new life now and forever. Cleansed of our unrighteousness and clothed with Christ's righteousness, we have a clean and good conscience before God today, tomorrow, and on the Last Day. *O Lord, should a guilty conscience seize me, remind me that I am baptized into Christ and cleansed by His blood. Amen.*

SAT

SCRIPTURE: **Psalms 27 Confidence in the LORD**

Psalms 27 is a beautiful prayer of confident trust in the LORD's providential care. Since the LORD is our light and salvation, our strong fortress of refuge and shelter in the day of trouble, there is nothing in this life to truly fear. And yet, David still calls upon the LORD for instruction, guidance and protection from his enemies; the devil, the world and the sinful nature. Because the LORD is faithful and trustworthy, David bids God's people to wait for the LORD, to trust in Him at all times and for all good things. Those who do so are strong and can take courage to face anything in this life. *O LORD, grant me faith to wait for and to trust in You for all things needful, through Jesus Christ. Amen.*

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
