Around the Word Devotions + the week of January 22-28, 2017

THEME OF THE WEEK: God Manifested in the Power of Jesus to Heal

Christ is made manifest in mercy. Many people want God to make the world a *fair* place, but God's epiphanies are always in acts of unfair mercy. It is love that takes shape and form, revealing Jesus to be God. It is this love that bears the cross for sinners so that in faith we may see Him for what He is. When we read the Bible looking for fairness, rules, equality, or salvation by works, we always miss Jesus. When the Spirit moves us to look for Christ in the Word, we find hope that cannot be destroyed. The Scriptures show acts of mercy for sinners as promises of the same mercy given to you, a sinner that Jesus died for.

SUN

SCRIPTURE: Matthew 8:1-13 Christ destroys sin and restores community

Being alone often sounds great until you actually are alone. The leper and the paralytic were both cut off from their lives, vocations, and loved ones. They were alone. Jesus, by the power of the same word that spoke creation into existence, draws what is unclean, broken, and sinful into Himself to bear it to the cross, where He is alone, cut off from God. You are not alone. Christ takes what is defiled in you and bears it to the cross. His Word is still spoken to you in Holy Absolution, that you might have the same restoration, community, and life. *Lord Jesus Christ, grant that by Your word, our sins would be forgiven, that we would have the same measure of Your peace. Amen.*

MON

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 15: Jesus is the fulfillment of the law for you.

When we hold the law up to ourselves we find it to be true, but not frightful. It reveals and accuses our sins. David describes the ideal citizen, something we should strive to be in our vocations. He promises whoever lives up to the law's standards will never be moved. But we are sinners. Our feet slip due to sin. However, it is Christ who sets His cross upon the LORD's holy hill, fulfilling the law for us. He promises never to be moved from His seat of mercy. It is still good to strive to love your neighbor, but our help and our salvation is in the LORD. *Lord Jesus Christ, You alone walk blamelessly. Look upon us in everlasting compassion, that we may evermore dwell with You. Amen.*

TUE

SCRIPTURE: Romans 12:16-21b Jesus died for your neighbor.

Jesus died for your neighbor. Sometimes that's the best thing you can say about them. They're sinners too, but their sins were already paid for by the same Christ who forgives you. There are no more sins to punish according to Jesus and His death on the cross. We are not kind to sinners in order to anger them and secretly laugh. Instead, we treat each sinner as if Christ has actually made them as holy as He has made you in your baptism. If their sins can't uncrucify Christ, He has merited their peace as well. *Lord Jesus Christ, help us to see Your cross as the source of all forgiveness, both for ourselves, and for our neighbor, that we may ever find forgiveness for those who sin against us. Amen.*

WED

SCRIPTURE: Matthew 19:27-30 Christ restores His creation in love.

Jesus isn't encouraging you to turn your back on your families who don't believe, or to imagine your salvation is dependent upon giving up property. He's talking about the real life damages caused by sin and unbelief. It divides families and homes. Jesus promises salvation for those hurt by sin. The first shall be last. The last, first. Christ, who is first, will give up everything to save you, that even if you have nothing left, He will restore what was damaged by sin completely. He bears the sin in your place, and promises you salvation. *Lord Jesus Christ, grant at last Your healing touch to those homes damaged by sin. Amen.*

THU

SCRIPTURE: Luke 17:5-10 I can't move the stupid tree.

I can't move the stupid tree. If I can't even do that, how can I believe my way up to heaven? Christ's promise to save isn't based on our worthiness, but His love. We are unworthy servants. He saves us anyway. I will not believe my way into heaven, but Christ died and was raised for me and won for me the kingdom. Faith clings to His promise to save the unworthy. God gave you your faith. It's enough, because your Father in heaven doesn't give you bad gifts. *Lord Jesus Christ, save Your unworthy servant, and send Your Holy Spirit, that trusting in You, we may find peace in You as our justification. Amen.*

FRI

SCRIPTURE: Hebrews 11:1-16 Faith is not a checklist, but a hope that God saves sinners.

We didn't choose our religion by going through a checklist. I wasn't baptized because I wanted a faith that rejected evolution, homosexuality, and had a story about a giant boat. Faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. By faith victims of murder are made alive. By faith drunks and adulterers are called saints. By faith sinners, all sinners, are forgiven and justified. The promise of our salvation greets us from afar, but our God sends His Spirit to call, gather, enlighten, sanctify, and keep. Faith is hope that Christ's death and resurrection unite us to our heavenly home, even from afar. *Lord Jesus, send Your Holy Spirit, that we would ever be kept in faith, and finally see You face to face. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 33 God tends to get His way.

God tends to get His way. He wanted it to be light and it was. He spoke and it happened. When He speaks you to be righteous, He gets His way. When He promises you salvation, it is good. Although we don't see it yet, we hear God's promise and hope. He is our help and our shield. Whatever things look like, we know His victory. He has spoken it. It is finished. Our sins are forgiven. We are baptized and absolved. We eat His body and drink His blood. He speaks it is, and it is good. *Let Your steadfast love, O LORD, be upon us, even as we hope in You. Amen.*
