THEME OF THE WEEK: The Holy Spirit: Creator of the Church

When Jesus ascends to fill all things, He also sends to us the great gift of the Holy Spirit. Through the Holy Spirit we are taught the words of the Father and Son. We are granted the peace of God. SCRIPTURE: John 14:23-31 – Words of the Trinity

God gives us words. They flow from the Father to the Son. They are words of eternal life. And now that Christ has ascended, the Holy Spirit has been sent to bring those same words to us. Jesus says that the Holy Spirit comes to us for this purpose, to teach us all things and to bring to our remembrance His words. From those words flow to us the great gift of peace. As we live in a world which brings us tribulation, we have words from the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit which bring us peace, eternal peace in the forgiveness of our sins, and which make us unafraid. *Blessed Trinity, we give You thanks for speaking Your words of peace and life to us that we may be strengthened in this life to life everlasting. SCRIPTURE: Psalm 48 – The Steadfast Love of God

“We have thought on Your steadfast love, O God, in the midst of Your temple.” So sings the church. We are consumed with considering the steadfast love of God. We can’t get it off our minds. We can’t stop singing about it or talking about it or confessing it. It’s on our lips and minds and heart. Because there is no greater thing for us to consider: our Lord has created us, redeemed us, sanctified us in the truth, has preserved us in the true faith, and will call us to be with Him to await that Last Day when we are raised to eternal life. He does all this because of His steadfast love toward us, that which we hear over and over in His temple, the church. *Dear Jesus, thank You for loving me even unto death that I would live eternally with You. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: 1 Peter 4:7-11 e – For Your Neighbor

The Lord exhorts us to use the gifts we have been given for the benefit of our neighbor. We are to love one another in order to cover their sins. We use our love, received from God in our forgiveness, to forgive those who sin against us. We show hospitality joyfully, for the Lord has been hospitable in giving Himself over into death for us. Even our self-control and sober-mindedness is for the benefit of others, that we would learn to pray for them diligently. From these things, from living a Holy Christian life, the Lord Himself is glorified, because it reflects who He is and what He has done for us. *Holy Lord, help me to live a holy life toward You and my neighbor, that You may be glorified by my works and words. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Joel 2:28-32 – The Spirit of God Who Rescues Us

At Pentecost, the words of the Prophet Joel come to pass. The Lord’s Spirit is poured out on the multitude. The Son has ascended and the Holy Spirit has been sent to bring all people to a saving knowledge of Jesus. The Holy Spirit descends to bring to our minds and hearts the name which is above every name, the name of Jesus, at which every knee shall bow, and upon which many will call and be saved. The Holy Spirit has descended and rescued many from the bondage of sin, death, and the devil, calling them out of darkness and into His light. And this is true not just for those at Pentecost, but for us also. *Heavenly Father, thank You for sending Your spirit to me through Your Word that I may call upon the name of Jesus and be saved. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: John 14:15-21 – Delightful Commandments

One of the reasons the Holy Spirit is given to us is so we learn to rejoice in and love the Lord’s Commandments. Jesus tells us that if we love Him we must keep His commandments. He is not saying that we must keep the law perfectly in order to be saved. Rather, those who love the Lord will also love and cherish His Words. They will guard and keep His commands. By the Holy Spirit we learn that these words are not simply rules for how to live your best life now, but they are God’s ordering of creation for our good and the good of our neighbor. They are a delight to us, because the Holy Spirit has made them a delight. *Blessed Lord, help me to always delight in Your Commandments. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Ephesians 4:7-16 – The Gift of the Pastor

When Jesus ascends and sends the Holy Spirit, one of the gifts He gives us is the Office of the Holy Ministry. The office exists to equip the saints with His Word. It exists to perform the ministry of Word and Sacrament to deliver the faith. It exists to build up Christ’s body, the Church, through His teaching. Using pastors, Jesus guards us from false doctrine, that would shipwreck our faith. He unites us in true doctrine, and teaches us to love one another as Christ has loved us. We learn from pastors to love through pure doctrine and the forgiveness of sins. That’s what the Holy Spirit gives through the Office of Pastor. *Dear Jesus, thank You for sending me pastors who teach me the faith that saves. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 145 – The Mighty Work of Salvation

We are charged, as God’s people, to proclaim the deeds of the Lord from one generation to the next. And while there are many great and mighty wonders which the Lord has performed: the Red Sea, the Manna, the many healings, etc., there is one which stands greater than all the others and which the others point us toward. The Lord, being gracious and merciful, comes into our flesh, dies our death, crushes the serpents head, draws us out of bondage, and is raised on the third day. The Lord, in His mercy, forgives our sins. The Lord promises the resurrection of our bodies on the Last Day. Such are the wondrous works of God. Such are the things we proclaim. *Blessed Lord, thank You for Your mighty work of saving me and all those You have called. Amen.*

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
