Around the Word Devotions + the week of November 4-0, 2018

THEME OF THE WEEK: The Blessedness of the Saints of God

The devil, the world, and our own sinful flesh: these wage war against the faithful. God has promised to conquer sin on the cross and defeat the devil, AND to work through a world broken by our sin, to sustain us until we are brought into the resurrection. Government has never been a perfect thing since the fall. God has still worked through it. We sinners call Jesus Lord. He is Lord of the devil's too. He's even Lord to a world set against Him. God isn't just in control. He has promised to work to the goal of your salvation.

SCRIPTURE: Matthew 22:15-22 - What Belongs to Caesar that God Didn't Give?

Church and state don't always play nice. It's left us calling the enemy of our enemies "friend." We'd like clearer lines between church and state, retreating into "our territory." We don't feel safe. We like this verse because we think it shows a separation between church and state, but God created both. He just works differently through each. To "render unto Caesar" is to trust that God can work even through sinful governments. Jesus called right "right" and wrong "wrong" to kings and servants alike. We don't change our ideals. We trust that God can work through Caesar. Lord God, aid our president and government and lend to them wisdom, working through them for the good of all. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 124 Calamity Isn't Proof There's No God

It's easy to assume every pain I have is evidence of the absence of God and His favor. David doesn't cite his enemies or the floods as proof there is no such thing as a loving God. He recognizes that his being brought through them is wholly of God's mercy. God doesn't will sinners to sin, or find pleasure in the damage our sins have waged on creation. God doesn't promise a world with no sinners (you included), but promises to bring the faithful through flood, torrent, and enemies alike in spite of our sin.

Deliver us from our enemies, O LORD, for our help is in the name of the Lord, who made heaven and earth. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Philippians 3:17-21 They Glory in their Shame, We Glory in the Cross of Christ.

The world walks as enemies of Christ. They aren't just content to sin in secret. They glory in what should be shameful. They name organizations dedicated to immorality. Does proving them wrong save you? The world doesn't need culture warriors. It needs Jesus, who bore the cross even for his enemies. We preach Christ crucified. We call evil shameful, but also speak forgiveness. We don't align with the world, our citizenship is in heaven. Let us glory, not in winning fights, but in the cross of Christ. Lord God, call to repentance those who war against You, and cover their sins by Your blood, that we may all be transformed to be like You in the resurrection. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Isaiah 32:1-8 Our Lord Stands on Noble Things.

Our Lord stands on noble things. His promises stand on a firm foundation. The world calls evil "good" and good "evil," but our Lord promises a place and a time where what has been made wrong through sin will be made right again. This kingdom comes not by our building something perfect, but from the noble act of sacrifice where Jesus died for the world to redeem it. In days where fools are called "noble" and scoundrels "honorable," look to the Lord and know He plans noble things. He has died and is risen to redeem us.

King of Kings, make righteous what sin has wronged through Your noble sacrifice, and call us ever to see and speak the truth in Your mercy. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Mark 12:41-44 God Doesn't Care about Percentages, Just Trust.

Want to make people argue in church? Talk about tithing. God clearly doesn't care how much money we give. The widow gave very little. So we argue about percentages: "She gave all she had. You should give at least 10%." Probably. The real issue is our fear. We're afraid. The widow is not commended for her generosity, but her faith. Our God, Who even allowed her husband to die, will sustain her. Her tithe isn't a bribe, but a recognition. "This mite belongs to God, and so do I. In wealth or poverty, He will not forsake me."

Heavenly Father, use the gifts You have given us to the glory of Your holy will. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Romans 13:1-7 Your Government is a Gift from God.

God gave you President Trump. God also gave you President Obama. Does God give us bad gifts? Authority comes from God, and with purpose. Government's role is to punish evil and reward good. But we have gotten quite used to calling the party we didn't vote for evil. Respect to whom respect is owed. Honor to whom honor is owed. Not because they earned it. Not even because they're right all the time. Because God works through sinners to punish evil and reward good through them. It's God's government, after all. Heavenly Father, sustain our government and cause peace and prosperity to flourish in our land through them. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 31, third part Oh, How Abundant is Your Goodness.

We live in a besieged land. The devil, the world, and our own sinful flesh wage war against us. We take refuge in the Lord. He hides us from the accusations of the devil, clothing us in baptismal robes of Christ's righteousness. He hears our pleas for mercy and answers our prayers for help. Even as we wait for the Lord, we are shown where He has already worked to save us.
