SCRIPTURE: John 16:16-23c The World will Rejoice

You will weep and lament, says Jesus, but the world will rejoice. The powers of the air, the prince of this world, the devil and all his hoards rejoice at the death of the Son of God, for it seemed that they had won. God had died. In a similar way, the unbelieving people of our world even now delight in the death of God. For it seems to them that they are now gods, capable of choosing for themselves what is good. But the Christian knows better. Our sorrow is turned into joy at the resurrection of Jesus. God is not dead but alive. Hell has not won, but is defeated, and we are citizens of His kingdom. God be praised. Lord, I thank You for Your resurrection that has brought me so much joy. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 75 God is Judge

Most in our world are desperately trying to make a name for themselves, trying to make a buck, trying to make it seem like their life matters in some way. It is all just self-justification — the idea that I by my works and effort can vindicate my existence. The psalmist reminds us that exaltation comes neither from the east nor from the west, that is, from the powers of this world, but from the Lord. He is judge. The Judge Who is coming does not care what you have done to satisfy your own standards, but His. But also in Christ you have a Judge Who declares you justified, that is righteous not for your works, but for His. We give thanks to You, O God, for Your wondrous works declare Your name is near. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: 1 Peter 2:11-20 We are Pilgrims

Peter exhorts his hearers to submit to all manner of earthly authorities and to keep their conduct honorable among unbelievers — as sojourners and pilgrims. That is a reminder to us that first, our behavior toward others does have something to do with how God wishes to serve and call others to repentance and faith. And second, that this world is not our home. We are as Christians on pilgrimage to our better home, the reign and kingdom of Christ which is already ours by faith in Christ. Lord, keep us steadfast throughout our days of pilgrimage, that others may see our works and glorify you because of them. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Lamentations 3:18-26 Bearing up in Suffering

Our lives, like the prophet's, are full of anguish and suffering. And yet the prophet encourages us to place our hope in the Lord's mercies, which are new every morning. No matter what kind of wormwood and gall afflict you in this present hour of darkness, the Lord comes with fresh mercies at the dawn. His mercy endures forever. Sometimes it is our lot to simply *wait*, to wait quietly for those mercies and salvation to come from the Lord. He will do it. He is faithful. Lord, in You do I hope. *Let me never lose my ability to wait for Your mercies. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Luke 10:1-9 Learning to Trust

The preaching disciples had to learn how to trust. They were to take nothing with them. The necessary tools of comfort and safety — money, bag, extra shoes — were to be left at home. The Lord would provide. Later on He would have the disciples provide for themselves the necessities, but now His lesson needs to be heard and learned; We are to trust in the Lord's provision of daily bread — those things which body and life require. Only when we realize that it is the Lord Who provides do we rightly give thanks for them and trust in the Lord's provision for us. Lord, I do trust in You. Lead me to trust You more. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Hebrews 4:14-16 Our Great High Priest

Jesus is God. But He is also man — our brother. And not only our man and brother, but our high priest. The priest is one who advocates for his people, who goes into the breach for them, who offers up the oblation to God so that His people would not be consumed. Jesus is that eternal high priest who has not offered up the blood of bulls, but His own blood that we would have an eternal redemption. And this high priest is One Who knows us, knows our every weakness, that we would have sympathy and compassion in our sins. Jesus is our High Priest, our Brother, our Advocate, and our God. Lord, You understand me. Have mercy on me and be my advocate. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 146 Jesus is King

We are not to put our trust in princes, for on the day of his death all his plans perish with him. Our political heroes, our philanthropists, our media and tech gurus might have something to offer this life, but not eternity. But not so with the Prince of Peace. His plans are eternal and from everlasting, plans not for destruction and conquest, not for temporal alleviation of suffering, but for mercy and love, for eternal salvation and the true healing of the nations. Though dead once, He is living and out of the grave and now all kings and princes of the earth are to pay Him homage. His plans do not perish for He perishes no more. Lord, help me to not trust the men of this world, but only You for all eternal good. Amen.

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
